the meaning of Lent

Lent is the Christian season of preparation before Easter. The Lenten season is a time when we as Christians observe a period of reflection, prayer, repentance, moderation, self-denial and spiritual discipline. The purpose is to set aside time for reflection on Jesus Christ – His suffering and his sacrifice, His life, death, burial and resurrection.

The significance of the 40-day period (not including Sundays) is based on two episodes of spiritual testing in the Bible: the 40 years in the wilderness wanderings by the Israelites after the exodus from Egypt (Numbers 33:38 and Deuteronomy 1:3) and the Temptation of Jesus after he spent 40 days fasting in the wilderness (Matthew 4:1-11; Mark 1:12-13; Luke 4:1-13 So what does Lent mean to you and how do you intend to use this deep spiritual period as a time of examination and growth in discipleship? What better way than to participate in the many worship and study offerings that we have here at PDCPC during this time.

God clearly calls us to repent and reflect:

- "If my people who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land." 2 Chronicles 7:14
- "Repent and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord. Acts 3:19
- "For the Lord your God is gracious and compassionate.
 He will not turn his face from you if you return to him." 2
 Chronicles 30:9b
- "Peter said, 'Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins.
 And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:38
